She performs regularly at IWU contemporary music programs and collaborates with a wide range of instruments in varying musical styles.

The CMSA **EnMasse Orchestra** is conducted by **Dr. Jim Bates**, Director of Orchestral Activities at Otterbein University in Columbus, OH. He has degrees from the University of Louisville (B.M.E), a Masters in double bass from Indiana University and Ph.D. in Musicology from the University of Kentucky. He is an assistant conductor for the Westerville Symphony (OH) and Columbus Symphony Youth Orchestras. He is also music director of The Early Interval, Columbus' professional early music performance ensemble. Dr. Bates is very involved with CMSA as a member of its Board of Directors and chair of their educational initiatives.
